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The 22 outcrop photographs (Supplementary data a - v) show 5 m of section in the Woburn Sands near Leighton Buzzard in England. Each photograph covers around 30 cm of the section with a at the base and v at the top. Every photograph includes a survey staff marked in cm with decimeter labels for scale (0.1 is 10 cm and 0.2 is 20 cm). The colour of the scale on the survey staff changes every meter from black to red at 1.0 m and 3.0 m, and back to black at 2.0 m and 4.0 m. The pale coloured sands contrast with darker silty-mudstones that pick out sets of cross-strata as well as trace fossils. The photographs are freely available from the data archive at https://researchdata.bbk.ac.uk/71/.
